A touch of luxury in the wild

Set on a secluded island in the winding Kwando River, Kazile Island Lodge offers 13 Meru tents and is only accessible by boat. Here you'll be immersed in the sounds, scents and secrets of the wild – all while nestled in comfort and surrounded by a lush mangosteen forest.

The tasteful tented suites overlook the Kwando River as well as the expansive floodplains between the island and the famous Horseshoe Bend. This is where herds of buffalos and elephants traverse the wet Zambezi landscape. Sitatungas, an elusive aquatic antelope, are often spotted along the floodplains and marshes. The famous Horseshoe Lagoon is also the ideal spot for a breathtaking sunset sundowner. The silhouettes of hippos and elephants can often be seen in purple hues over the water.

Together with its sister lodge, Nambwa, Kazile Island Lodge is one of the only lodges uniquely situated within Bwabwata National Park, at the heart of the KAZA Transfrontier Conservation Area – the largest wildlife conservation area in the world. It's an enigmatic corner of Namibia and one you're sure to fall in love with.

Recharge next to the unspoilt Kwando

Explore the waterways and absorb the ambience of this beautiful wilderness. Or simply enjoy the sounds of birds chirping from your tented room with all the amenities you need.

Helpful information

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking is only allowed on the private, outside wooden decks that form part of each tented suite. Smoking is not allowed anywhere in the bush or public guest areas or while taking part in any activity.

LOCATION

Accessible from Kazile boat station approximately 11 km from Konpola, off the new tar road between Konpola and the Linyanti. From Kazile boat station it's a five minute boat cruise to Kazile Island Lodge.

LAUNDRY

A laundry service is available.

ELECTRICITY & WATER

- Kazile Island Lodge operates on 220V solar power, 24 hours a day.
- Guest accommodation is equipped with a 220-volt AC plug suitable for hairdryers and the recharging of camera and video batteries.
- Mineral water is supplied to guest rooms, however the lodge water is pumped from the Kwando River. It undergoes rigorous UV filtration and is safe for human consumption. Regular tests are performed to ensure we meet the highest safety standards.

DIETARY NEEDS

When making your reservation, please let us know if you have any special dietary needs.

PAYMENT POLICY

A 30% deposit is required at least three months prior to arrival, once a reservation is made. Full payment of the balance is due 30 days prior to guests arrival, unless the booking is made within 14 days, in which case full payment will be required to confirm the reservation.

For all bookings cancelled between:

- 60 and 30 days prior to arrival
– 50 % of the total amount will be due.
- 29 and 15 days prior to arrival
– 75 % of the total amount will be due.
- 14 and 0 days prior to arrival
– 100 % of the total amount will be due.

All major credit cards accepted.

SEASONS

- Green season: April – June, December – March
- Peak season: July – November

CHILD POLICY

- Children should be under the control and supervision of their parents at all times.
- Children between the age of 0 and 5 will be charged 25% of the adult rate.
- Children between the ages of 6 and 11 will be charged 50% of the adult rate. Children aged 12 count as adults and are charged the full adult rate.
- Private game drives or boat cruises are compulsory for guests travelling with children under 12.
- Cots are available.

Directions

FROM WINDHOEK

Kazile Island Lodge is located approximately 1114 km and 11 hours' drive northeast of Windhoek.

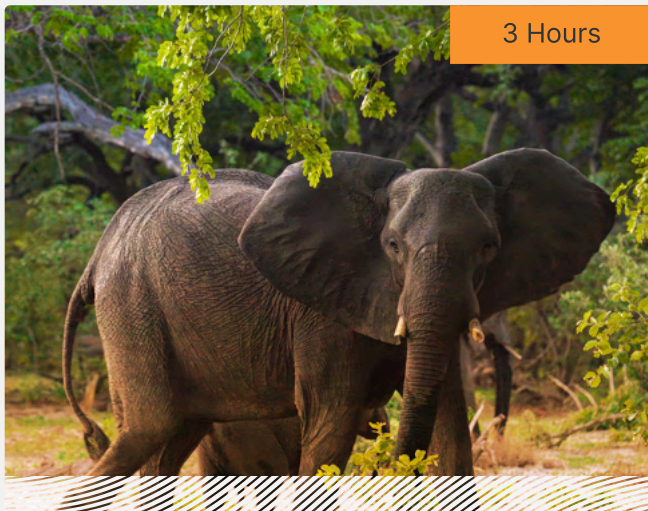
- Take the B1 from Windhoek to Otavi. At Otavi, turn right on the B10 and go northeast until Rundu. At Rundu, go east on the B8 for 200 km where you will cross the Okavango River at Divundu. You will pass through a police checkpoint. From the Divundu checkpoint you will drive a further 194 km until you reach the next police check point on the Kwando River.
- You will pass through a police checkpoint, drive a further 7 km to the Kongola Filling Station where you turn right onto the C49.
- Continue on the C49 for 11 km until the Kazile Island Lodge turnoff on the right (western side of the road). There is also a lay-bye under a big tree on the right. Turn off at the sign and follow the dirt road for 2.4 km. You will reach the river parking area where you will be met for your transfer to the lodge.

You do not require a 4X4 for the 2.4 km dirt road to the Kazile boat station. Your car can be parked safely at the Kazile boat station. A short 5-minute boat cruise along the Kwando River will take you to Kazile Island Lodge.

Hints and tips to make the most of your time in the bush

- Bring a good camera and binoculars. Take care not to disturb animals when using a flash.
- Bring sunglasses, a hat, sunblock, insect repellent and a sweater or fleece for evenings especially in the winter.
- During the winter, we provide blankets and hot water bottles if it's cold, and ponchos if it is raining.
- It's best to wear pale and neutral colours when going on wild experiences so as not to attract the animals' attention any more than necessary.
- Closed shoes are required for bush walks.
- We do provide basic fishing tackle, but you are welcome to bring along your own. Should you lose any of our tackle it will be charged additionally.
